Roth Award

The William Stanley Roth Award for Outstanding Chapter Service will be given each year to the outstanding Chapter which devotes the most service to the council, camps, community, and lodge.

At Fall Fellowship LEC, each chapter will submit a full, written narrative to the Roth Award Chairman; these reports are also to be given orally to the entire LEC. The report should cover the time span from the past Fall Fellowship to the present one, excluding the present event. The LEC should then vote on the best and second best chapters, with 2 points going to the best chapter and 1 point going to the second best chapter.

These points should be added to the points achieved through the following system:

Ten (10) points for each member holding an appointed Lodge Chairman position for the entire year 50 points

Two (2) points for each member that serves on a Lodge committee for the entire year 50 points

Chapter Leadership

Five (5) points for each member holding an elected Chapter position for the entire year 25 points

Two (2) points for each member holding a Chapter Chairman position for the entire year 16 points

Unit Elections

One (1) point for each percentage of eligible units in which an election was actually held. 100 points

Camp Promotion

One (1) point for each percentage of units in which an informational program was actually held. 100 points

Dues Payments

One (1) point for each percentage of members from prior year that pay their Lodge dues prior to 100 points

March 1st of the current year. > 80% dues = 100 points.

100 points for Gold JTE

75 points for Silver JTE

50 points for Bronze JTE

Unit Award of Excellence

100 points

100 points for 50% or more of the units in the District receiving this award.

50 points for 25% of the units in the District receiving this award.

25 points for 10% of the units in the District receiving this award.

Ordeal Completion

One (1) point for each percentage of eligible candidates that complete their induction in the 100 points

current calendar year. > 80% induction = 100 points.

Brotherhood Conversion

One (1) point for each percentage of eligible Ordeal members that obtain Brotherhood 100 points

within 2 years of eligibility

Chapter Meetings

Twenty-five (25) points for each chapter meeting held

250 points

Fifty (50) points for each overnight Chapter outing that does not coincide with another 100 points

organized event, where 25% of chapter members attended.

D. Horizon Experiences

One point for each percentage of youth membership that attends a function

conducted above the Lodge level, for example: SR-7 Conclave, Carolina Indian Seminar, NOAC, National Pow Wow, etc.

(Percentages for each applicable event will be added together.)

E. Training

Up to 25 points for each member that attends a leadership training class beyond LLD. 100 points

This might include LIFT, NLS, NLATS or other program. Contact Training Chairman for approval and point weighting.

Service:

A. Service Projects

00 points

One (1) point for each percentage of man-hours of service. Percentage of man-hour equals man-hours of service divided by chapter membership (as determined by the Lodge) times 100 Service can be provided at Lodge events, District events or community based. (Service hours may not also be double counted in any other category. I.e. you don't get service hours when doing a ceremony.)

25 points for organizing and leading a major service project at an OSR Camp.

50 points

Obtain approval from the Service Chairman prior to the event.

B. Ceremonies

10 points for each youth member performing an induction ceremony at Lodge events 5 points for each youth member serving as ceremony torchbearer at Lodge events

15 points for each youth member performing a ceremony at Conclave.

25 points for each youth member performing a ceremony at NOAC

1 point for each youth attending ceremony practice outside lodge events

C. AIA Program (Singing and Dance)

10 points for each youth member representing the Drum or Dance Team at scouting ceremonies or Lodge events as approved by the Chairman.

10 points for each youth member performing at Lodge or district events

15 points for each youth member competing at Lodge events

20 points for each youth member competing at Section events

25 points for each youth member competing at Regional events

50 points for each youth member competing at National events

D. Shows

50 points for chapter serving as Shows MC (does not include Shows Chairman)

50 points

. 10 points for chapter performing an a scheduled Lodge show 50 points

D. Newsletter

25 points per chapter issue (submit with Roth petition)

100 points

10 points per article submitted for the Lodge Tipi

100 points

E. Elangomats **

50 points are awarded for providing 1 trained Elangomat for every 5 Chapter Ordeal Candidates. Partial credit will be awarded based on the scale below. Elangomats can also backfill other chapters for 25 bonus points per Elangomat after their own Chapter needs are met. Bonus points are applied after both yearly Ordeals if the chapter has met their own goals, including 80% Ordeal member attendance)

F. Campsite Improvements

200 points

100 points for each campsite improvement project completed. Improvements are not limited to the assigned chapter site. Contact the Service Chairman for a list of projects or for prior approval of a new project. The goal is to have all sites at the same level.

G. Food Committee

200 points

25 points for each youth member serving on the cook crew for a weekend lodge event.
